**Subject: In Rep. Stephanie Murphy's District (FL-07), Strong Support for Reforms that Lower Drug Prices**

**Date: August 31, 2021**

A new Public Policy Polling survey conducted in Florida's 7<sup>th</sup> Congressional District finds that an overwhelming majority (89%) of voters think prescription drug prices in the country are too high. Voters of all political party affiliations agree: 94% of Democrats, 86% of independents, and 86% of Republicans think drug prices are too high.

Additionally, over three-quarters (79%) of voters support giving Medicare the power to negotiate lower prescription drug prices for all Americans (with 61% strongly supporting it). Almost two-thirds (65%) of Republicans and almost three-quarters (72%) of independents support giving Medicare negotiating power to lower drug prices, along with nearly all (96%) of Democrats.

Voters in Florida's 7<sup>th</sup> Congressional District reject the drug companies' argument that allowing Medicare to negotiate for lower drug prices would slow down innovation. By a margin of 61 points (71-10%), voters would rather "allow Medicare to negotiate with drug companies" than are concerned that it will "undercut drug companies' ability to innovate and develop new drugs." Voters older than 65 want Medicare negotiation over drug innovation by 72-10%.



The survey also finds that 71% of all voters and 76% of voters over the age of 65 strongly support making sure Americans do not pay more for the same prescription drugs than people pay in other countries. A further 65% of all voters and 73% of voters older than 65 strongly support using the savings from lower drug prices to provide hearing, dental, and vision coverage to seniors on Medicare as well as lower health insurance premiums for millions more.

Congresswoman Stephanie Murphy risks losing support from voters of all political affiliations if she opposes allowing Medicare to have the power to negotiate for lower drug prices. Almost half of those surveyed (43%) would be less likely to vote for Congresswoman Murphy if she opposed this reform, including 47% of Democrats, 34% of Republicans, and 47% of independents.

The findings make clear that there is an abundance of support among the voters of Florida's 7<sup>th</sup> Congressional District, across demographic lines, for reforms that would lower prescription drug prices, including giving Medicare negotiating power. Voters in this district have made clear they want their Member of Congress to support these reforms.

Public Policy Polling surveyed 618 Florida 7<sup>th</sup> Congressional District voters on behalf of Protect Our Care from August 25-26, 2021. The margin of error is +/- 3.9%. 42% of interviews for the survey were conducted by telephone and 58% by text message.
