Subject: Nevada Voters Oppose ACA Repeal; Voters Say They Will Blame GOP for Upcoming Rate Increases

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A new Public Policy Polling survey finds that, by a 17-point margin, Nevada voters oppose repealing the Affordable Care Act and instead want to keep what works and fix what doesn't. 46% of voters in Nevada say they would be less likely to vote for a candidate who supports repealing the Affordable Care Act. A majority of voters – 56% – say they'll hold Republicans in Washington responsible for health care premium increase announcements this summer and fall – a gaping 24-point margin over those who would not.

Key findings from the survey include:

- **By a 53-36 margin, voters say they want to keep what works about the Affordable Care Act and fix what doesn't, rather than repeal it and start over with a new healthcare law – independent voters agree by a 52-33 margin.**
- There's strong evidence that Republican efforts to repeal the ACA will hurt Nevada Republicans at the ballot box this November. 46% of voters say they'd be less likely to vote for a candidate who supports repeal, including 44% of independents and even 24% of Republicans.
- **Voters say they will blame Republicans if health care premiums increase this summer. 56% say they will hold Republicans in Washington responsible if rates increase, compared to just 32% who said they would not.**
- A majority of voters (55%) say they believe Washington Republicans and President Trump have been trying to undermine and sabotage the Affordable Care Act – and a majority of independent voters (59%) also say they agree with that statement.

PPP surveyed 572 registered voters Nevada from May 9-10, 2018. The margin of error is +/- 4.1%. The survey was conducted using automated telephone interviews for Protect Our Care.
