### By The Numbers: How Medicaid Strengthens South Dakota

Medicaid is not only a lifeline for millions of South Dakotans, it strengthens our communities in countless ways. These are reasons why the program is overwhelmingly popular: <u>74 percent</u> of Americans support Medicaid.

#### SOUTH DAKOTANS DEPEND ON MEDICAID

- **118,085 South Dakotans Are Covered Through Medicaid.** Over 118,085 South Dakotans <u>have medical coverage</u> through Medicaid most of them children, seniors, and people with disabilities.
- In South Dakota, Parents Up To 50 Percent Of The Federal Poverty Line May Enroll In Medicaid. By not fully expanding Medicaid, South Dakota has restricted its Medicaid program such that only Parents earning up to 50 percent of the federal poverty line are eligible to enroll in Medicaid. If South Dakota expanded its program, 80,000 more adults could gain coverage through Medicaid.

### MEDICAID IS A LIFELINE FOR CHILDREN, SENIORS, AND PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES

**32 Percent of South Dakota's Children Rely on Medicaid.** 32 percent of South Dakota <u>children rely</u> on Medicaid for coverage. Medicaid pays almost \$4 billion annually in school-based health services. Schools depend on these funds connect students with vital health resources — <u>68 percent</u> of school superintendents said that they used these funds to keep nurses, counselors, and speech therapists on staff.

**Medicaid Supports 52 Percent Of South Dakotans In Nursing Homes.** 52 percent of South Dakotans living in nursing homes <u>have coverage</u> through Medicaid.

**Medicaid Covers 15 Percent of South Dakota's Seniors and People with Disabilities.** In South Dakota, 15 percent of seniors and people with disabilities <u>have health coverage through Medicaid</u>, including for nursing home care. Nationally, approximately <u>one in four people</u> on Medicaid are seniors (9 percent) or people with disabilities (15 percent). However, their care represents about <u>two-thirds</u> of all Medicaid spending. In other words, funding cuts to Medicaid will disproportionately affect the most vulnerable.

#### MEDICAID HELPS SOUTH DAKOTANS ACCESS TREATMENT FOR OPIOID ADDICTION

**Medicaid Covers** <u>One In Four</u> **Americans With An Opioid Use Disorder**. Medicaid pays for 11 percent of South Dakota's <u>buprenorphine</u> expenditure, a medication used to treat opioid addiction.

# REPUBLICANS' WAR ON THE ACA AND MEDICAID JEOPARDIZES COVERAGE FOR NEARLY 120,000 SOUTH DAKOTANS

**118,085 South Dakotans With Traditional Medicaid Coverage, Including Seniors, People With Disabilities, And Children, Are At Risk.** The Graham-Cassidy bill that President Trump revived in his FY19 budget proposal would turn traditional Medicaid into a per capita cap, meaning the 118,085 South Dakotans who are <u>enrolled</u> on Medicaid would have their care jeopardized. Medicaid disproportionately helps children, seniors in nursing home care and people with disabilities. A study by <u>Avalere</u> found that Graham-Cassidy would cut funding for people with disabilities by 15 percent and 31 percent for children by 2036.

**80,813 South Dakota Children's Care Is At Risk.** 80,813 South Dakota kids are currently <u>enrolled</u> in Medicaid and CHIP, and their care could be at risk because of funding cuts in Graham-Cassidy.
