Subject: Maine Voters Want Senator Collins to Reject Kavanaugh's Supreme Court Nomination

Date: August 21, 2018

<u>A new Public Policy Polling survey finds that 49% of Maine voters already think</u> <u>Susan Collins should reject Trump's Supreme Court nominee Brett Kavanaugh.</u> Only 42% think she should vote to confirm him.

The more Mainers learn about Kavanaugh's positions on health care and *Roe v. Wade*, the less support he receives. <u>When Mainers learn that Kavanaugh will support President</u> <u>Trump's lawsuit overturning protections for people with pre-existing conditions, they are 58% less likely to support him and only 14% more likely.</u>

- When learning that Kavanaugh would likely tip the balance on the Court to overturn *Roe v. Wade*, voters are 54% less likely to support his confirmation, and only 24% more likely.

And if Senator Collins votes to confirm Kavanaugh, voters are far less likely to support her in her next election by 16 points - with 47% saying they would be less likely to vote for her and 31% more likely.

Maine voters also disagree with Senator Collins' willingness to vote on Kavanaugh's nomination without reviewing his full record. Maine voters overwhelmingly (62% to 33%) believe that there should be a complete and thorough review of Kavanaugh before holding a vote to confirm him to the Supreme Court, including all documents from his time on the US Court of Appeals and working in the Bush White House. <u>By 22 points (56%-34%), they don't believe Collins should vote to confirm him until that happens, including 57% of Mainers over 65 and 53% of independents</u>.

This poll also shows slightly more than a third of Mainers approve of Senator Collins' job performance, while 48% disapprove of the job she is doing for Mainers.

PPP surveyed 529 Maine voters from August 17-18, 2018. The margin of error is +/-4.3%. This poll was conducted by automated telephone interviews on behalf of Protect Our Care.
