Subject: Majority of Voters Support Key Elements of Democrats' Health Care Agenda

Date: May 6, 2019

Public Policy Polling conducted a new national poll for Protect Our Care of legislative proposals which based on press reporting are likely to be part of the House Democrats health care agenda and some of which will be considered as early as this week.

The new national Public Policy Polling survey finds that voters by substantial margins, including large numbers of independents and Republicans, support this House Democrats' health care agenda and specific legislative proposals within it. Overall, 54% of voters say they trust Democrats more on the overall issue of health care, with only 42% of voters trusting President Trump - an advantage that expands to 24-points (60%-36%) among independents.


THE DEMOCRATIC HEALTH CARE AGENDA

PPP tested these proposals that are core to the House Democrats health care agenda which will begin to come to the floor over the course of the next several months

- 90% of voters support ending the ban that prevents Medicare from negotiating with drug companies to get lower prices for prescription drugs.
- 85% support ending price gouging by pharmaceutical companies on common drugs such as insulin and EpiPens.
- 85% support prohibiting insurance companies from sending surprise medical bills where they charge higher out-of-network rates for services when a patient visits an in-network hospital or medical practice.
- 82% support making it more difficult for big drug companies to block new, cheaper generic drugs.
- 70% support requiring all health insurance plans to fully cover more basic services such as primary care visits and seeing a specialist before charging a deductible or copay.
- 69% support stopping insurance companies from selling junk health insurance plans that do not cover prescription drug costs or protect people with pre-existing conditions.
- 69% support guaranteeing that more Americans can buy health insurance for less than 10 percent of their income.

REPUBLICANS HEALTH CARE REPEAL, SABOTAGE AND OVERTURN

The Affordable Care Act itself remains popular, with 65% of voters wanting Congress to keep what works in the ACA and fix what doesn't, compared to only 30% who want to see Congress repeal the ACA and start over with a new healthcare law. 78% of Democrats and 77% of independents would most like Congress to keep what works in the ACA and fix what doesn't instead of repealing the ACA and starting over.



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




Similarly, 58% of voters say they do not think the ACA should be struck down by the courts as the Trump administration is demanding in a Texas court.

President Trump's proposed budget which includes \$1-trillion cuts to Medicaid and \$845-billion cuts to Medicare is even less popular, with 66% of voters opposing the cuts and only 20% of voters supporting them. A majority of voters across all age demographics also oppose cuts to Medicaid and Medicare, including 61% of voters aged 18 to 45, 68% of voters aged 46 to 65, and 67% of voters over 65. 75% of Democrats, 72% of independents, and 50% of Republicans oppose the Trump administration's proposed cuts to Medicaid and Medicare. Only 30% of Republicans and 12% of independents support these cuts.

PPP surveyed 658 national voters on May 1, 2019. The margin of error is +/- 3.8%. This poll was conducted by telephone on behalf of Protect Our Care..
