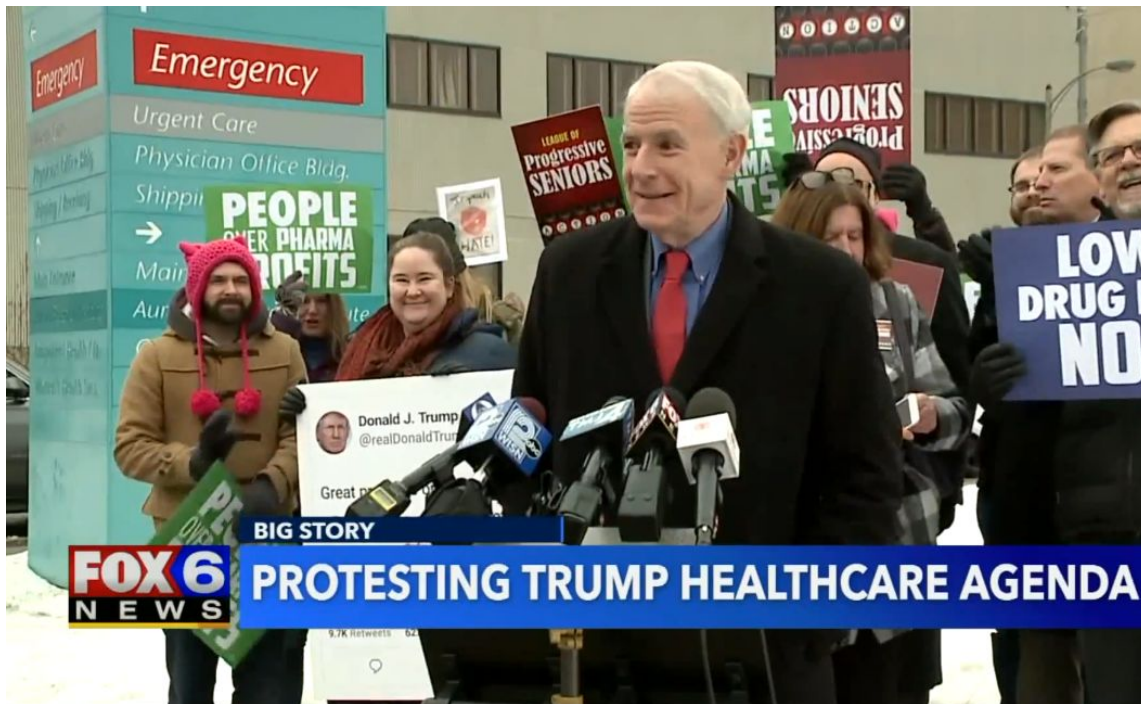

Trip to Wisconsin puts Trump's ongoing sabotage of Affordable Care Act front and center

WISCONSIN — This week, President Trump visited Wisconsin, putting front and center his administration's ongoing attempts to sabotage the landmark Affordable Care Act and his ongoing, "brazen" lies about the issue. Monday, President Trump was [roundly criticized for lying about his commitment to protecting individuals with pre-existing conditions](#).

As the President arrived in Milwaukee on Tuesday health care professionals, patients, and advocates rallied to shine a light on the President's broken promises on health care - including the threat he poses to those with pre-existing conditions and his failure to make good on a 2019 promise made in Mosinee to take swift action on the rising cost of prescription drugs.

Dr. Rob Davidson, executive director of the Committee to Protect Medicare, said [at least 7 million people](#) have lost health insurance since Trump started his term.

If the ACA is repealed, [around 24 million Americans](#) could lose their health coverage, Davidson said.

"It's between co-pays and deductibles, the price of prescription drugs," Davidson said. "We know what we need to do for people, we swear a Hippocratic Oath when we finish medical school and then the system itself doesn't allow us to do those things." ([read more](#))

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
