Subject: Voters Say Health Care a Key Issue in Presidential Vote; Trust Biden and Democrats More On the Issue

Date: November 3, 2020

A new Public Policy Polling survey finds that health care is a key issue for a large majority of voters in the 2020 election for President, with 63% considering it either the most important issue or a very important issue when it comes to their vote for President.

When given a list of choices and asked which is most important to their vote for President, 78% of voters listed either health care or responding to coronavirus among their top two issues.

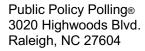
Voters who are concerned about healthcare voted overwhelmingly for Joe Biden: 78% of voters who consider healthcare to be among their top two most important issues say they voted for Joe Biden, while just 12% of those voters say they voted for Donald Trump.

All this adds up to a decisive win for Joe Biden over Donald Trump, with 54% of voters surveyed saying they voted for Biden and just 42% voting for Trump in the Presidential election.

Other key findings from the survey include:

- 56% of voters say they trust Joe Biden more on the issue of healthcare, compared to just 38% who said they trust Donald Trump more. Independents say they trust Biden over Trump on healthcare by a 50-41 margin.
- Similarly 56% of voters say they trust Democrats more on the issue of healthcare, compared to just 41% who say they trust Republicans more. Independents say they trust Democrats over Republicans on healthcare by a 52-41 margin.
- Large majorities of voters support a series of actions Congress could take to address healthcare, with a combined 92% strongly or somewhat supporting giving Medicare the power to negotiate for lower prescription drug prices; a combined 75% strongly or somewhat supporting providing financial assistance so healthcare premiums cost no more than 8.5% of a person's income; and 66% strongly or somewhat supporting creating a government sponsored public health insurance option that would be an additional alternative to private insurance plans.

Public Policy Polling surveyed 1,031 American voters from November 2-3, 2020. The margin of error is +/- 3.1%. 50% of interviews for the survey were conducted by telephone and 50% by text message.
