Sen. Hickenlooper, State Lawmakers, Advocates Call for Expanded Access, Lower Costs of Health Care for CO Families

Stop is part of Protect Our Care's Nationwide "Lower Costs, Better Care" Bus Tour"

DENVER, CO - This afternoon, Protect Our Care's "Care Force One" arrived at Colorado's State Capitol building to demonstrate the need for lowering Coloradans' health care costs, expanding coverage, and reducing racial disparities in care. Headlined by U.S. Senator John Hickenlooper, the event highlighted action already taken and next steps to continue making quality health care more accessible to Coloradans.

"The American Rescue Plan saved Coloradans thousands of dollars on health care. It lowered health insurance premiums by 49 percent on Connect for Health Colorado," said **Colorado Senator John Hickenlooper**. "We've got to make sure these changes are permanent."

Throughout the nationwide <u>"Lower Cost, Better Care"</u> bus tour, Protect Our Care is fighting to ensure critical health care measures supported by President Biden remain in upcoming budget reconciliation legislation. These priorities include giving Medicare the power to negotiate for lower drug prices for all Americans, getting more Americans covered by closing the Medicaid gap, expanding Medicare benefits to include hearing, dental, and vision, and further reducing health care premiums for millions of Americans who purchase coverage on their own.

The Colorado State Legislature also passed landmark health care legislation in the 2021 session, including <u>The Colorado Option</u> to increase access to quality, affordable health care and <u>Senate Bill 175</u>, to create a prescription drug affordability board. Senator Julie Gonzales, who spoke at today's event, sponsored Senate Bill 175.

"Many of the people I talk to are deciding between keeping the lights on and purchasing a life-saving medication, which is why we had to take action to lower the costs of prescription drugs," said **State Senator Julie Gonzales**. "I'm proud to have sponsored Senate Bill 175 which is estimated to save Colorado families up to 75% on the costs of the most unaffordable drugs."

"Coloradans depend on affordable health care, expanded access to coverage, and drug pricing reform to live healthy lives," said **Colorado Option sponsor Rep. Iman Jodeh**."The Colorado option is a landmark step toward helping families afford critical health care, but now we need federal action to reduce costs and expand coverage."

The lawmakers were also joined today by Colorado health care advocates and patients.

"I have personal experiences with the high cost of healthcare and prescription medications," said **Coloradan Mariah Zebrowski Leach**. "I was diagnosed with rheumatoid arthritis at the age of 25, and since my diagnosis, figuring out how to pay for expensive prescriptions has become a huge part of my life. Once I received a bill for over \$10,000 for the medication used in a single infusion. We need policies that lower the cost of vital prescription medications and make healthcare more accessible and affordable for everyone."

"When I was fighting stage 4 cancer, I had to forego medication that would boost my immune system because the price tag was simply too high." said Denver health care **advocate Laura Packard**. "I wound up in the hospital, and nearly died. Sadly, stories like these are all too common in our country. Patients should be able to focus on getting well, not struggling to pay for medications. That's why we need Congress to act now to lower the cost of prescription drugs, including allowing Medicare to negotiate prices on behalf of all Americans."
