Subject: American People Reject the GOP Health Care Agenda

Date: July 12, 2023

A new Public Policy Polling survey finds that the American people reject the Republican party's health care agenda. When asked at the start of the poll, by a 13-point margin, voters say they trust Democrats over Republicans when it comes to health care (49-36), including a majority of independent voters (53-25). When they hear about the Republican Congressional health care agenda, a majority of Americans (52%) agree that Republicans in Congress are waging a war on health care, while just 40% disagree.

Americans hold favorable views of the major health care laws that Republicans in Congress are trying to undermine. They view Medicare favorably by a 48-point margin (66-18), Medicaid by a 20-point margin (48-23), and the Affordable Care Act by a 12-point margin (47-35).

Meanwhile, the Republican proposals for health care face deep opposition across party lines, in most cases even from a majority of Republican voters.

- 78% of American voters oppose risking Medicare benefits by ending the program after 5 years, taking away health care millions of seniors have earned. This includes 82% of independents, 67% of Republicans, and 84% of seniors over the age of 65, while just 13% overall support it.
- 77% oppose eliminating the requirement that insurance companies cover preventative health care like mammograms and cancer screenings, including 78% of independents, 64% of Republicans, and 81% of voters aged 46 to 65. Just 14% overall support it.
- 74% oppose taking away free access to vaccines like the shingles vaccine for seniors, including 80% of independents, 57% of Republicans, and 80% of seniors over the age of 65. Only 17% overall support it.



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- 75% oppose taking away Medicare's new power to negotiate lower prices for prescription drugs, including 82% of independents, 61% of Republicans, and 78% of seniors over the age of 65. Just 17% overall support it.
- 73% oppose taking away the \$35 per month cap on the price of insulin for seniors.
 This includes 84% of independents, 57% of Republicans, and 77% of seniors over the age of 65. Only 16% overall support it.
- 70% oppose passing more tax cuts for the drug and insurance companies while they are making record profits. This includes 66% of independents and 56% of Republicans, while just 18% overall support it.
- 66% oppose taking away Medicaid from millions of people who count on it for health care. Those opposed include 69% of independents and a plurality of Republicans (48-37). Just 26% overall support it.
- 60% oppose eliminating the \$2,000 annual out-of-pocket limit on how much seniors have to pay for prescription drugs, including 63% of independents and 58% of seniors over the age of 65. Only 27% overall support it.

Public Policy Polling surveyed 736 national voters from June 23 - 24, 2023. The margin of error is +/- 3.6%. 50% of interviews for the survey were conducted by telephone and 50% by text message. The survey was conducted for Protect Our Care.
