## Nearly three-quarters of Americans favor President Biden and Democrats in Congress passing Medicare negotiations.



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### Arguments for giving Medicare the power to negotiate with drug companies for lower prices are extremely strong.

Convincing reason to support Medicare having the power to negotiate drug prices

Americans should not have pay three times more for medicines than people in other countries do, as is currently the case. **Giving Medicare the power to negotiate with drug companies will help bring the price of medicines in the U.S. more in line with what other countries pay**.

The top 8 drug companies made \$110 billion in profits last year, and the largest drug companies paid their CEOs an average of \$36.4 million. Patients should not be paying excessive amounts for the medicines they depend on to pay drug company profits and foot the bill for outrageous CEO salaries.

**Prescription medicines cannot work if people cannot afford to take them**, and high drug prices are keeping too many Americans from the health care they need.

Millions of Americans cannot afford their medicines while drug companies make huge profits, and high drug prices force many seniors to skip doses to make their prescriptions last longer. It is the responsibility of our leaders to make sure Americans do not have to choose between paying for the medicines they need or paying for food and rent.






