Subject: Healthcare Is an Important Issue for Wisconsin Voters; Strong Concerns About Possible Outcomes of Repealing the Affordable Care Act

Date: July 16, 2024

A new Public Policy Polling survey finds that 85% of Wisconsin voters, including 78% of Republicans and 80% of independents, say that the issue of healthcare is important to them when thinking about voting this year, with 54% saying it is very important, and only 5% saying that it is not important at all.

An overwhelming majority (89%) of all voters, as well as 84% of Republicans and 87% of independents, agree that lowering prescription drug prices and health insurance premiums is an important way to help people afford the cost of living, with only 7% of voters disagreeing with this statement.

A majority of voters (55%) have a favorable opinion of the Affordable Care Act (ACA). 53% of independents have a favorable opinion of the ACA, along with 24% of Republicans.

Republicans in Congress have tried to repeal the ACA for years and Donald Trump has pledged to “terminate” the law, but when voters are given some possible outcomes if the Affordable Care Act were to be repealed, they express significant concerns:

- 67% of voters are concerned when hearing that more than 100 million people with pre-existing conditions would lose their protections and 54 million people would likely become uninsurable. This concern is shared by most independents (64%) and 45% of Republicans.
- 73% of voters are also concerned (with 62% having very serious concerns) that insurance companies would be allowed to charge an age tax—allowing them to charge people 50 or older five times more than younger adults for their health insurance. This concern is shared by a majority of both Republicans (58%) and independents (70%).
- 69% of voters have concerns that over 45 million people who were able to get health insurance because of the Affordable Care Act could lose coverage and become uninsured. 65% of independents are concerned by this possible outcome, and 42% of Republicans share this concern.

62% of voters, along with 36% of Republicans and 60% of independents, think the government should continue to provide financial assistance through the ACA to lower the costs of health insurance premiums for lower- and middle-income people.



53% of independents say they would be less likely to vote for a Republican candidate after hearing that Republicans want to block Medicare from negotiating lower prices for prescription drugs, which would mean that drug companies could charge as much as they want. 52% of independents say they would be less likely to vote for a Republican candidate after hearing that Republicans in Congress voted against capping the cost of insulin at \$35 per month for seniors on Medicare.

Voters over the age of 65 are particularly concerned about healthcare:

- 94% find the issue of healthcare important when it comes to voting this year.
- 93% agree that lowering prescription drug prices and health insurance premiums is an important way to help people afford the cost of living.
- 57% have a favorable opinion of the Affordable Care Act.
- 79% are concerned that more than 100 million people with pre-existing conditions would lose their protections and 54 million people would likely become uninsurable if the ACA were to be repealed.
- 85% are concerned that repealing the ACA would allow insurance companies to charge an age tax—allowing them to charge people 50 or older five times more than younger adults for their health insurance.
- 78% are concerned that over 45 million people who were able to get health insurance because of the Affordable Care Act could lose coverage and become uninsured.
- 67% think the government should continue to provide financial assistance for lower- and middle-income people who buy health insurance on their own or through the Affordable Care Act.
- 56% would be less likely to vote for a Republican candidate after hearing that Republicans want to block Medicare from negotiating prescription drug prices.
- 55% would be less likely to vote for a Republican candidate after hearing that Republicans in Congress voted against capping the cost of insulin at \$35 per month for seniors on Medicare.

When asked “If the candidates for President this fall were Democrat Joe Biden and Republican Donald Trump, who would you vote for?” 47% said Joe Biden, 46% said Donald Trump and 7% said not sure.

PPP surveyed 653 Wisconsin voters from July 11-12, 2024 for Protect Our Care. The survey’s margin of error is +/-3.8%. 65% of interviews for the survey were conducted by text message and 35% by telephone.
