Toward A Government

Shutdown To Perpetuate The GOP Health Care Crisis



There's no question about it: Republicans are hell-bent on raising costs and ripping away health care from millions of Americans. Since taking power, Donald Trump and Republicans in Congress have launched an all-out assault on American health care, hiking premium costs on the middle class, slashing Medicaid, driving rural hospitals off a cliff, and creating chaos.

Hospitals, nursing homes, and care facilities across the country are shutting down in the wake of these draconian cuts, and premium costs are skyrocketing for families across the nation. Hundreds of hospitals, nursing homes, and care facilities across the country are reducing services, laying off workers, or closing their doors. Entire communities are being stranded without essential care. Meanwhile, insurance companies have already indicated that, because of the GOP budget bill, they plan to hike premiums for 24 million Americans. At the same time, Republicans eliminated key tax credits that helped over 20 million Americans afford coverage. Combined, these changes mean millions will see their premiums nearly double this fall.

Republicans are only just beginning to feel the heat as outraged Americans face the consequences of the Trump-GOP bill. Constituents are angry about the big, ugly bill, which takes health care away from more than 15 million people and raises costs for tens of millions more to fund tax breaks for billionaires and big corporations. They have created a disaster with no end in sight, and now Republicans are driving toward a government shutdown as they demand a bill that inflicts pain on families just so billionaires can get richer.

Trump and Republicans' Signature Policy Achievement This Year: Raising Costs and Ripping Away Health Care From Millions of Americans. A new damning CBO score on Trump and Republicans' Big, Ugly bill showed that it will:

- Rip health care away from over <u>15 million Americans</u>, including seniors, children, veterans, and people with disabilities, to pay for tax breaks for billionaires like Elon Musk and large corporations.
- Cut over \$1 trillion from Medicaid and the ACA to pay for handouts to the wealthiest Americans.
- Hike premiums for over <u>24 million</u> Americans, including rural Americans, small business owners, and middle-class families.
- Impose a sick tax on over 20 million low-income people, hitting them with new bills each time
 they see a doctor for diabetes, arthritis, or other illnesses.
- Threaten to shutter over 330 hospitals, 570 nursing homes, and hundreds of clinics across the country, forcing more Americans to travel further for maternity care and emergency rooms, and face longer wait times and higher costs.
- Generate billions in tax breaks for the rich by choking seniors and working families in red tape and making it harder to enroll in Medicare and Medicaid.
- Trigger nearly \$500 billion in cuts to Medicare by exacerbating the national deficit.
- Force low-income seniors to pay thousands more each year for health care by raising their premiums and out-of-pocket costs.
- Force over <u>5 million people</u> into medical debt by causing families who lose their coverage to take on an average of \$22,280 in medical debt when they previously had none.
- Give away <u>billions</u> to drug companies at the expense of seniors and taxpayers by driving up the
 cost of prescription drugs for seniors on Medicare.

- Americans Continue To Reject Trump and Republicans' Big, Ugly Bill
 - As of mid-September, new polling shows that Americans continue to oppose Trump's Big, Ugly Bill.
 - <u>53 percent</u> say the Big, Ugly Bill will hurt the average American.
 - <u>51 percent</u> oppose Trump and Republicans' Big, Ugly Bill.
 - A majority (63 percent) believe Republicans put the interests of the rich ahead of those of working Americans.

Trump Disapproval Soars

- Trump's net approval rating has been negative every day since March 12th <u>181 days in a row</u>.
- Nearly a majority of Americans now *strongly* disapprove of the job Trump is doing as president.
- <u>Less than a third</u> of Americans a dismal 31 percent currently say they are satisfied with the direction of the country.
- <u>60 percent</u> disapprove of Trump's performance on inflation and the cost of living.
- <u>58 percent</u> of Americans disapprove of Trump's job performance, up 7 percent since April.
- Less than 40 percent of Americans approve of Trump's job performance.
