


Summer From Hell: Republicans Take the Heat Following Devastating Vote to Rip Away Health Care

Summer may be coming to a close, but Republicans are only just beginning to feel the heat as outraged Americans face the consequences of the Trump-GOP bill. Constituents are angry about the big, ugly bill, which takes health care away from more than 15 million people and raises costs for tens of millions more in order to fund tax breaks for billionaires and big corporations.

Hospitals, nursing homes, and care facilities across the country are shutting down in the wake of these draconian cuts, and premium costs are skyrocketing for families across the nation. Hundreds of hospitals, nursing homes, and care facilities across the country are reducing services, laying off workers, or closing their doors. Patients will be forced to travel hours, sometimes hundreds of miles, to reach the nearest emergency room – even in life-or-death situations. Entire communities are being stranded without essential care. Meanwhile, insurance companies have already indicated that, because of the GOP budget bill, they plan to raise premiums for 24 million Americans by an average of 15 percent. At the same time, Republicans eliminated key tax credits that helped over 20 million Americans afford coverage. Combined, these changes mean millions will see their premiums nearly double this fall. But instead of warning families about the huge cost hikes headed their way, the Trump administration is covering them up.

There's no question that Donald Trump had a terrible August. Polling shows that Americans broadly disapprove of the big, ugly bill and the unpopular, dangerous Trump-GOP war on health care, with Less than a third of Americans currently saying they are satisfied with the direction Trump and Republicans are taking our country. Donald Trump and Republicans in Congress broke our health care system, and now they own every single devastating consequence.

New CBO Score Breaks Down Trump and Republicans' Big, Ugly Bill. A new damning CBO score on Trump and Republicans' Big, Ugly bill showed that it will:

- Rip health care away from over 15 million Americans, including seniors, children, veterans, and people with disabilities, to pay for tax breaks for billionaires like Elon Musk and large corporations.
- Cut over \$1 trillion from Medicaid and the ACA to pay for handouts to the wealthiest Americans.
- Hike premiums for over <u>24 million</u> Americans, including rural Americans, small business owners, and middle-class families.
- Impose a sick tax on over <u>20 million</u> low-income people, hitting them with new bills each time they see a doctor for diabetes, arthritis, or other illnesses.
- Threaten to shutter over 330 hospitals, 570 nursing homes, and hundreds of clinics across the country, forcing more Americans to travel further for maternity care and emergency rooms, and face longer wait times and higher costs.
- Generate billions in tax breaks for the rich by choking seniors and working families in red tape

- and making it harder to enroll in Medicare and Medicaid.
- Trigger nearly \$500 billion in cuts to Medicare by exacerbating the national deficit.
- Force low-income seniors to pay <u>thousands</u> more each year for health care by raising their premiums and out-of-pocket costs.
- Force over <u>5 million people</u> into medical debt by causing families who lose their coverage to take on an average of \$22,280 in medical debt when they previously had none.
- Give away at least <u>\$5 billion</u> to drug companies at the expense of seniors and taxpayers by driving up the cost of prescription drugs for seniors on Medicare.
